IT Security Tip: Protect Sensitive Data



As many of our campus community members return to campus, we want to share the importance of securing [sensitive data](#) on your computers and on physical documents. Remember to:

- Always lock your workstation when you step away from your office or computer.
- Avoid printing sensitive information, especially in public areas.
- Clear sensitive, nonpublic information from your desk (e.g. sticky notes, papers, printouts, etc.)
- When participating in virtual meetings that could be considered sensitive, use headphones to prevent others from hearing unauthorized information.
- Keep laptops, tablets and smart phones in sight, especially in unsecured areas.
- Put documents into Shred-It boxes when they are no longer needed.
